Greetings In Christ!

“Imagine No Malaria” – prevention, treatment, and education – is possible, if the leadership of The United Methodist Church is successful, by the grace of God, to be successful in our efforts by 2015, to overcome the reality of a child dying every thirty seconds in Africa from this preventable disease. “The world already possesses the treatment and the preventative measures to eliminate more than 1 million deaths each year caused by malaria.”

San Saba First United Methodist Church has three young energetic Christian disciples, who have volunteered, and are leading our efforts in San Saba to overcome deaths from malaria in Africa – J. T. Mathis, Elizabeth Bryant, and Ryan Guidroz. We shall be hearing from this ‘mission team’ in the very near future and learn more about the disease, treatment, and prevention.

“Many United Methodists have joined in the fight already against malaria through the “Nothing But Nets” campaign, which provides nets for protection of individuals while sleeping, from the disease bearing mosquitoes. As our first step in this effort, The United Methodist Church partnered in an effort to cover the entire country of Sierra Leone with insecticide-treated bed nets. However, there is much more we need to accomplish, if we are to eradicate all deaths from this preventable disease.”

“Every 30 seconds a child loses their life to malaria. YOU can make a difference: \$5.00 provides one course of treatment to a child with malaria. \$10.00 sends a life-saving mosquito net to a family in Africa. \$20.00 provides food and treatment of anemia for one pregnant woman with malaria.”

Therefore, when you hear the message J.T., Elizabeth, and Ryan will offer our congregation over the next few months, please pray about your role in eradicating malaria in Africa, and saving the lives of millions of children from this preventable disease. Please pray unceasingly to make the “Imagine-No- Malaria” campaign a reality!

First Music




Tiger Cubs


