

Finance Committee Plans Stewardship Sunday

It is that time again—the one time each year that the church asks us to estimate our giving to the General Fund for the next year. Money does matter if a church is doing what it should be doing, if ministries matter to that church. We should give not only to support our church, but also because it's necessary for our own spiritual well-being. The following quote is from an article quoted in the SWTC Treasurer's Newsletter. "It doesn't matter if you only have a bit to give...give as Jesus gave to us, willingly and totally. Give as God gave Jesus, lovingly and completely. The amount is not the important consideration. Giving because you have been given God's grace, the greatest gift of all, is what matters."

The good news is that we are presently meeting all of our obligations and are without debt. The bad news is that our expenses have exceeded our income so far in 2012. The church's fixed expenses have increased by over \$2000 per month.

We have set Sunday, November 18, to be Stewardship Sunday. This is the Sunday that we declare our plans for giving to the church for the next year. A "Giving Plan Form" will be in your bulletin on Sunday, November 11, so that you may take it home with you and prayerfully consider your giving decision for next year. On Stewardship Sunday, November 18, you will have the opportunity to fold it and place it in the offering pl

ate during the worship service. There will be a supply of Giving Plan 2013 forms on the table next to the front door on that Sunday for your convenience.

If you want to make a <u>pledge</u>, indicate the amount that you want to pledge on the first line. If you do not wish to make a pledge, please use the second line to give us an <u>estimate</u> of what you hope to be able to give. If you are unable to attend worship on November 18, you may place your "Giving Plan Form" in the offering plate on the next Sunday or bring or mail it to the church office. (P O Box 487).
